CHEMICALS TRANSCRIPT

STAND UP SARAH - Hello, I'm Sarah Gilbreath, welcome to the Department of Housing's Go Green Series. In this episode we're going to look at some of the products that Housing uses to clean your residence halls.

SARAH VO - Chlorine used to be a major player in the war on dirt but that product is eliminated since Housing uses only green products in the residence halls.

Whether it is the floors, wall or sink these products are safe for the environment and for all workers and residents.

SOT MARCIA KINSTLER, "If you've got a harsh chemical or something with a lot of odor to it, that is going directly to your brain and it has a suppression impact on your brain, your ability to think ... it affects how you feel. So yes, there's a real tangible, measurable difference with green cleaning"

STAND UP SARAH - We came out to Skyles walkway to challenge the residents to a smell test. They're going to smell two different cleaners, let's see their reactions.

SOT STUDENT, "I think this one"

SOT SARAH, "It's actually this one! This one is called OxyOrange."

SOT STUDENT, "I'm surprised..."

SOT SARAH, "You're surprised this one cleans as well?"

SOT STUDENT, "yeah because you'd think they'd use the more stringent one on dorm rooms which is used by everyone so...that's interesting"

SOT WANDA WILLIAMS, "My team is committed to using products that are environmentally safe and want to do our part to make sure the air quality is good. They're safe for the residents and they're safe for the environment".
